Debt, Tax, and Public Finance

- "Cancel the debt" isn't just a slogan-it's about survival. In Sri Lanka, nearly half of government revenue goes to debt repayment, while only 13% is left for health. That means fewer clinics, fewer nurses, and more families left behind
- Debt payments don't fix economies-they drain them. This isn't reform, it's control. #CancelTheDebt #RiseFor
- Tax justice isn't just about money. It's about power-who pays, who doesn't, and who decides. #RiseFor
- Every tax break for the rich means less for everyone else. #TaxTheRich #RiseFor
