Get ready to stand in solidarity against the IMF and the World Bank

Film screening and discussion: Life & Debt

Join us for our next #BlackBandThursday action on 6 April 2023 where we will **stand together in solidarity against the IMF and the World Bank**. Globally the IMF and the World Bank's neoliberal agenda is driving inequality, with more and more countries and people towards breaking point. This year we will be increasing our collective campaigning against this destructive role, and push for alternatives to the current economic system that serve people and planet.

Thursday 6 April sees the return of our monthly #BlackBandThursday action. This month you can host a film screening of *Life & Debt* documentary and have a discussion afterwards on the issues raised in this film, and what this means for our struggles to fight inequality across the world.

What is the Life & Debt documentary about?

Released in 2001, this hard hitting documentary examines the impact of the IMF's global economic policies on Jamaica's people and economy. Life & Debt exposes the devastating impact of loans from international lending agencies on Jamaica's economy, which owes over \$4.5 billion to the IMF, the World Bank, and the Inter-American Development Bank (IADB). The country is paying out increasingly more than it receives in total financial resources, resulting in increased unemployment, sweeping corruption, higher illiteracy, increased violence, prohibitive food costs, dilapidated hospitals, and increased disparity between the rich and the poor. The film also highlights the exploitation of workers in Free Trade Zones, where women sew five-six days a week for American corporations for the legal minimum wage of \$30 USD/week. Foreign companies are allowed to bring in shiploads of material tax-free to have them sewn and assembled in factories in the FTZs, then immediately transported out to foreign markets. The Jamaican government also agreed to the stipulation that no unionisation of workers is permitted in the Free Trade Zones, and the women who have spoken out and attempted to organise to improve their wages and working conditions have been fired and included on a blacklist.
