Introduction

The Fight Inequality Alliance (FIA) is committed to ensuring fair and equitable compensation across the diverse locations in which it operates. As a global organisation, FIA recognizes the varying economic contexts and cost-of-living differences across countries, and this is carefully considered when setting salary scales.

In our approach to compensation, FIA benchmarks itself as offering salaries that are **slightly higher than local NGOs**, but **lower than international NGOs (INGOs)**. This reflects our commitment to ensuring that salaries remain competitive while also aligning with the values of equality and fairness that drive our mission.

FIA's salary scales are designed to:



- **Reflect local economic realities**: By adjusting salaries according to the cost of living and economic context in each country, FIA ensures that team members are fairly compensated in relation to their local environment.
- **Balance local and international benchmarks**: In positioning our salaries between local NGOs and INGOs, we aim to offer competitive remuneration while maintaining a balance between organizational sustainability and fairness to team members.
- **Promote consistency across locations**: Although salaries are adjusted for local contexts, our goal is to ensure that the compensation structure is aligned across all countries where FIA operates, promoting fairness and consistency.

Salary Structure Overview

- The salaries for each country are categorized into entry, mid, and maximum levels, which are adjusted based on local economic factors. The salary structure ensures that FIA team members are compensated in a way that reflects their experience and responsibilities within the organization.
- In addition to base salaries, FIA provides a 30% benefit allowance to cover medical insurance, pension savings, and remote work support. This ensures that team members have access to necessary benefits to maintain their well-being while contributing to FIA's mission. The benefit allowance is included in the monthly package.
 - e.g. team member X is based in Afghanistan and is offered the role and the Entry point of the Level 8 scale as follows:

Benchmarking Approach

• FIA positions itself to offer salaries that reflect our unique position as a global movement addressing inequality. Our benchmarking approach includes:



- Localized Salary Adjustment: Salaries are adjusted according to local living conditions, ensuring that all team members are fairly compensated regardless of location. FIA uses local benchmarks to ensure the salaries are competitive and fair within each country.
- **Comparison to Local and International NGOs**: In recognizing the diverse global workforce, FIA positions its salary scale between the typical pay levels of local NGOs and international NGOs, ensuring we can attract and retain talent while being sustainable.

Application of Scales

FIA's salary scales apply to full-time employees, with prorated scales for part-time team members. Typically, offers are made at the entry level, with progression through the scale based on performance and experience.

FIA's compensation strategy is designed to reflect our mission and values. We are committed to providing fair and competitive salaries that take into account the diverse contexts of the countries where we operate, ensuring that our team members are compensated fairly for their contributions to the fight against inequality.
